As we hope you'll see through this year's annual report, GSN was able to *Pivot Toward Our Potential* this past year, embracing new opportunities for systemic impact:

- Merging with two organizations and bringing Alternative Roadmap and Empowering Education into the GSN family. This expanded our services to support student and teacher social, emotional, and mental health and reach disengaged learners affected by COVID-19.
- Pivoting our SEL curricula and professional development to focus on the challenges of the day: SEL Essentials; Teacher Self-Care; Exploring Culture, Identity, and Social Justice; and Healthy Relationships. Our team also began translating resources into Spanish.
- Standing up statewide support and connections for principals and superintendents reducing isolation and the burden of finding solutions to COVID-19 educational challenges.
- Growing our organization at a time when our nation struggled with a
 multiplicity of issues, even launching new innovation around education
 completion for youth involved in the justice system in partnership with
 the Attorney General's Office.
- We also expanded our board of directors, launched new college/career pathways, and gained traction on our expansion efforts in Arizona and Ohio.

The 2020-2021 school year (our second year of operating during the pandemic) has now come and gone, and yet again, I am grateful for the innovations and resourcefulness of our organization to respond directly to the needs of the schools and districts we serve thanks to the help of our supporters.







NEW SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT & CRISIS RESPONSE WEBINARS

GSN launched <u>webinars for school leaders</u> from Colorado, Arizona, and Ohio to discuss how to utilize Every Student Succeeds Act funds.

The Colorado Rural Education Collaborative (CREC) partnered with the Colorado Rural Alliance and the Department of Education to host a monthly superintendents' forum to support COVID-19 problem-solving.

COLLEGE & CAREER



NEW COLORADO-BASED NETWORKS

GSN's College and Career Readiness (CCR) work expanded greatly by hiring a Senior Manager of CCR and launching the Front Range Equity Network and the Interstate-76 Corridor *Partnerships for Prosperity*. These efforts focus on student achievement and partnering with businesses to create employee pipelines.

SOCIAL CAPITAL PLAYBOOK ADVISORY BOARD

GSN deepened its college/ career readiness expertise by partnering with the Christensen Institute and helping them build their new Social Capital Playbook for schools; GSN CEO Wendy Loloff Cooper served on a Social Capital Playbook Advisory Board with others across the country.



COLORADO RURAL EDUCATION COLLABORATIVE (CREC)

The CREC expanded this year with key initiatives such as the Student-Centered Reporting Solution, Social Emotional Learning, and teacher retention, growing to 72 member districts!







STUDENT-CENTERED **ACCOUNTABILITY** PROGRAM (S-CAP) **WRAP-UP**

S-CAP creates a peer-based accountability system that factors in the "whole child" and engages the local community in assessing school quality and reaching strategic goals. GSN was able to see value in a fledgling idea at an early stage and get it ready to fly on its own.







JUVENILE JUSTICE EFFORTS

GSN was selected as a School Justice Innovation Grant recipient by the Colorado Attorney General's Office. This new program focuses on eliminating barriers for justice-engaged youth to re-enter and succeed in school.



HEALTH & WELLNESS

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) EXPANSION & CURRICULUM

GSN is a state and national leader in SEL, and combined with Empowering Education and Alternative Roadmap, reached 120,000+ students in roughly 200 K-12 schools across 30+ states. GSN created new SEL program features: curricular units on *Coping with Crisis*, *Protecting Our Privacy*, and *Exploring Culture*, *Identity*, *and Social Justice*, asynchronous teacher professional development, and an online curriculum for grades K-8.

1006 students and 90 teachers participated in the 2020-2021 End-of-Year Advocacy/SEL survey. Overall...

of students feel connected to a caring adult in their school.



of teachers agree that they have developed meaningful relationships with their Advocacy/ SEL students. 88%

of teachers feel "mostly confident" or "highly confident" in their ability to support students in their SEL skill development. 84%

of students agree that they develop skills that will help them in school, work, and life during their SEL lessons.

CREATING HEALTHY SCHOOLS

Fit and Flow, a partnership between GSN and SoundOff, conducted 12 unique types of classes, through a live broadcast, with modalities ranging from HIIT/Bootcamp, dance, kickboxing, and BAARE to help keep students active during the pandemic. Participating schools included AXL, Primero, Early College of Arvada, and Omar D. Blair!



WHAT'S NEXT?

UNITS IN SPANISH

GSN demonstrated its commitment to equity by committing to translate all of its SEL unit student materials into Spanish (worksheets, teacher scripts, key vocabulary). For the 2021-2022 school year, the full scope of GSN's units is available with these translations accompanied by family letters (in Spanish) to introduce parents, caregivers, etc. to the SEL topics their students are learning.

NEW ONLINE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT **COURSES**

As a result of continued growth in online and hybrid learning for both students and adults, GSN released new asynchronous courses for teachers. Topics include "SEL Essentials" and "Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion"!
