- MS Healthy Relationships: This unit is intended to help students understand and learn how to establish healthy relationship expectations and understand healthy relationship boundaries.
- ES Growth Mindset: Students will learn the difference between fixed and growth mindset, and identify how both mindsets look, sound, and feel. They will discover the power of "yet," learn why the brain is like a muscle, understand why mistakes are to be celebrated, and experience the concept of "productive struggle."
- HS Effective Communication for Healthy Relationships: During this unit, students will be asked to explore effective communication, which is the ability to calmly and clearly communicate a message and ensure it is received.



Each of these units is now available with student-facing materials in Spanish!

- ES Starting Strong: This unit is designed to start strong socially and academically. It can be used any time of year, but does a great job of establishing healthy social and academic foundations and equips educators with resources around building a positive school culture that supports executive functioning.
- HS Service Learning: Students will begin this unit by exploring the concept
 of engaged citizenship. They will then be introduced to the idea of service
 learning and develop a project that is framed by the question "Where do
 my interests, talents, and a community need meet?" In small groups, they
 will create detailed action plans for their project, which they will then
 implement. This unit can be used to help students meet community service
 requirements for graduation.
